### Paul Isaacs Conference and Cartoon Drawing Workshop Friday 3rd March, 5pm-7:30pm

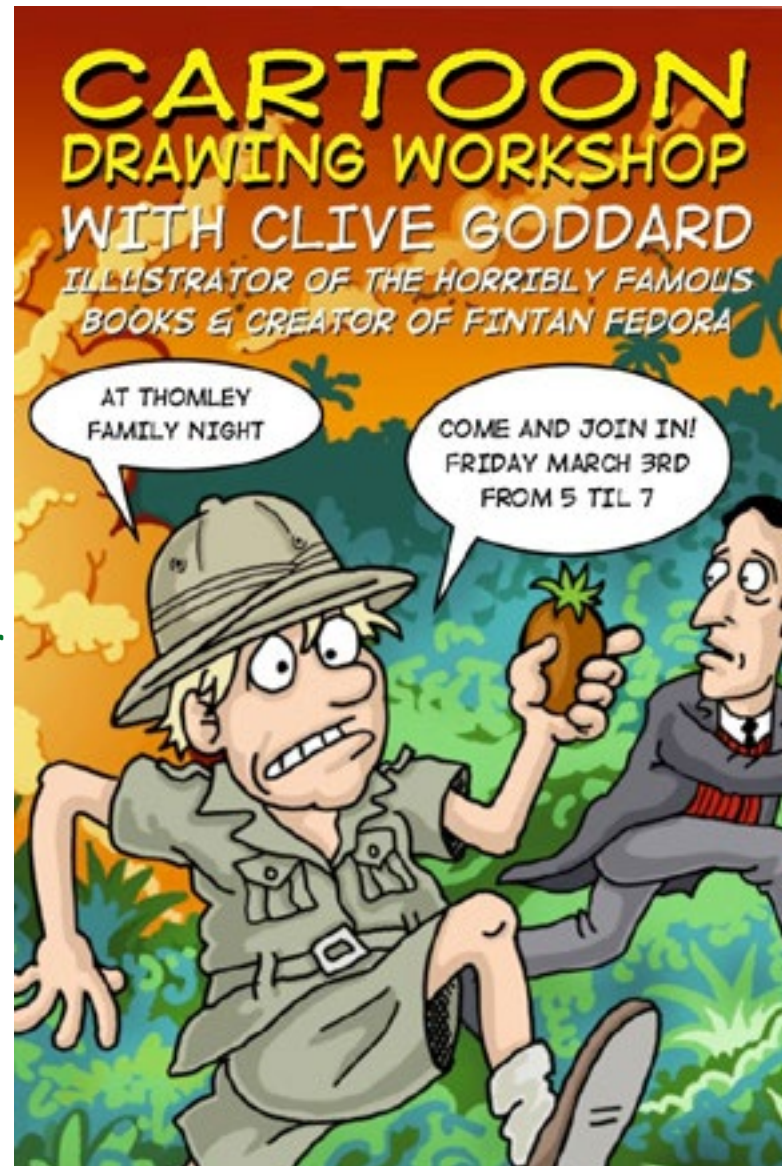
Paul will be giving a talk in the pavilion between 6-7pm on 'Sensory issues and Processing', followed by a Q & A.

## Food for birthday parties...

In our last newsletter we told you about our new birthday party options and we said you would be able to add food to your party.

There are three main options for your party:

### **Option one - £4.50 per child**

A platter selection of cheese and ham sandwiches, bowls of crisps, carrot & cucumber sticks, mini muffins and strawberries and unlimited squash

### **Option two - £5.50 per child**

Individual animal lunch boxes consisting of ham or cheese sandwich, packet of crisps, Kit Kat and drinks carton

### **Option three - £5.80 per child**

Hot dogs, crisps, carrot & cucumber sticks, either mini muffins OR fruit kebab sticks and unlimited squash

# TESCO Bags of Help

**Thomley calls out for votes to bag a share of bag charge fund, and is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.**

Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch the monthly funding scheme, which sees grants of £5,000, £2,000 and £1,000 – all raised from the 5p bag levy – being awarded to local outdoor community projects.

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and this month shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant. We are one of the groups on the shortlist and would really appreciate you voting for us, the more votes we get the higher the chance of a larger sum coming our way.

Voting opened from 2nd January and remains open until 28th January. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop. We are in the following stores: Warners End, Grove Hill Hemel, Barnacres Hemel, Northchurch, all Aylesbury stores, Hemel Hempstead Extra, Wendover Express, Berkhamsted Metro, Tring Superstore.

Tesco's Bags of Help project has already delivered over £24 million to more than 2,400 projects up and down the UK. Tesco customers get the chance to vote for three different groups each month. At the end of each month, when votes are collected, three groups in each of Tesco's regions will be awarded funding.

**Lindsey Crompton, Head of Community at Tesco, said:**

“We are absolutely delighted to open the voting for January. There are some fantastic projects on the shortlists and we can't wait to see them come to life in hundreds of communities.”

## The teenage building...

With the pavilion now being open, it means the teenage and adult building (where reception currently is) can be used as it should be, for teenagers and adults.

The kitchen (orange room) will no longer be where you get your tea and coffee, but will be a life-skills room for our teenagers and adults. You may find on some days these rooms are closed. If your teenager wants to go and use any of these rooms at any time please just ask at reception.
